PRESIDENT'S REPORT SEASON 2022/23

The 2022/23 Pennant season and financial year has, on both fronts, continued the success of 2021/22.

Following such a successful year it is no surprise that a report such as this will recognise and thank all of those in the Adelaide Bowling Club community that have played their part in that success. With more than 20 individual contributors and because there is considerable overlap in our various spheres of success, the report does suffer from repetition. I trust the reader will accept this repetition for the emphasis and recognition it deserves.

On the greens, the 2022/23 season was completed with 4 of our 7 sides qualifying for finals.

Saturday Pennants

Our Premier 1 side finished 3rd but was eliminated by Ascot Park on an 18-second deck at Grange.

The Division One side, in their first year in this Division finished second and were eliminated in the Preliminary Final by Payneham.

The Division 3 South side, in their first year in the Division, finished in 8th position.

The Division 5 East side, in their second year in this Division and a shaky start to the season finished 7th.

The Division 7 East side struggled to field a side early but then saw a group of Night Owlers come to the rescue so we managed to field a side every week in the second half of the season and finish in 8th position.

Wednesday Pennants

Our Premier 1 side, in their first year in this Division, finished third after 11 wins, 5 losses and 2 drawn games. Unfortunately, we were eliminated by Payneham in the Preliminary Final.

The Division 3 East side finished top and won the grand final played at Walkerville against Payneham.

Selection

Thanks to our Chair of Selectors Greg Arnfield and all those who performed the extremely difficult role of selector including, Brett Davis, Andy Feijen, Chris Firth, Allan Hurst, Steve Hicks, Bob Boorman, Bruce Bate, Steve Heath, Kylie Hurst, Wayne Darling, Dennis Taylor, Alister Behenna, Garry Benveniste, Barry Lilly and Don Stevens.

As in most, if not all bowling Clubs, selection can be a source of friction, dissent and unfortunately withdrawal in the face of selection decisions with which individuals disagree. Our Club was no exception over the 2022/23 season and we can do better, particularly with respect to the communication of the reasons for selection decisions to effected individuals.

Bowls Premier League (BPL)

The BPL returned to its normal two tournament programme over 2022/23. Our Adelaide Pioneers finished in second place at Brisbane in November and at Moama (NSW) in February 2023 we finished 8th.



We were again represented by Scott Thulborn, together with SA's ex-Jackaroo Wayne Ruediger, with New Zealand Women's Champion Katelyn Inch joining the team again this year. Coach Les "Bushy" Carter again steered the side through the closely fought event in Brisbane while Henry Higgins was a fill-in coach in February as Les had international commitments.

Greatly improved sponsorship arrangements were achieved this year. Coopers Brewery came on board as our major BPL sponsor with CFS Gear and Henselite continuing to support the Pioneers.

Club Operations

Two key developments over the past 12 months have assisted the financial performance of our Club. Firstly, the outdated kitchen has had a complete refit and secondly, we contracted an excellent Caterer in September 2022. Mick Menzies and his staff have added a new dimension to our Club and made it a preferred destination in the Adelaide venue hire market. Our position in that market is unique as we offer a true lawn bowling experience on top of excellent food and quality service from our staff so ably led by our Venue Manager.

Mulvea McGovern has been in the job 2 years now and her impact on the efficiency of operations and consequent profitability of our Club has been nothing short of outstanding. It is with great regret and sadness that I accepted Vee's resignation in April this year. In her inimitable professional approach to everything she does, Vee has given us 5 months notice, will be part of the process to recruit her replacement and will be part of a one month overlap with the incoming Venue Manager. Vee's last day as Venue Manager will be Friday 29th of September 2023.

As foreshadowed in my last annual report the introduction of enhancements and reporting capacity to our point-of-sale system (Bluize) and replacement of the MYOB accounting package with Xero has occurred and Xero is well bedded down with invaluable oversight from our highly competent contract book keeper, Stef Koeppen. These changes have reduced the quantity of manual processing of transactions and take advantage of 21^{st} century technologies in our accounting and reporting requirements.

However, it appears that Bluize is not keeping up with the requirements of the business and we may need to replace it. Similarly, the efficiency of transactions between, catering, venue hire (bookings) and the complexities of associated financial arrangements needs to be enhanced with some tailored off the shelf hospitality software.

In a report such as this there are many volunteers that should be thanked and there is no doubt that I will omit important contributors to our Club and the events we run. For that I apologise.

Again, the retired gentlemen who comprise the Monday Morning Blues, Bruce Bate, Alister Behenna, Chris Firth, Yanni Frangos, John Higgins, Ron Davidson, Gary Julian, Simon Franks and others that occasionally contribute to the maintenance and upkeep of the Club and surrounds have done a magnificent job.

The Night Owls crew are regular Wednesday night contributors assisting Paul Wilson in putting on the best Night Owls experience in Adelaide; these volunteers include amongst others, Buddha Hocking, Henry Higgins and Kylie Hurst.

Our relationship with Paul Zerella's Project Wine and Barry White's Gomersal Winery continue as highly valued ongoing sponsors of the Club.



I continue to be indebted to several people who have provided me with unwavering support and assistance. I thank our five Life Members who were not on the Board, Garry Benveniste, Bob Boorman, Ron Kuczmarski, Phil McDonald and Bruce Wallace; our Immediate Past President, John Higgins; our Green Keeper and gun bowler, Scott Thulborn; and of course, my fellow Board Members . . .

Ron Davidson who holds the House and Grounds portfolio has done an incredible job harnessing the considerable energy of our Monday volunteers and pursuing all opportunities for improvement. Unfortunately, Ron is retiring from the board.

Vice President Steve Hicks whose role as chair of the Bowling Operations subcommittee of the Board has provided me (a bowler of just six and half years) with a regular and reliable font of wisdom on all matters bowls. Unfortunately, Steve is retiring from the board.

Rachel Krebbekx who recently returned to the Board and has done an outstanding job in organising Club events and dinners. Unfortunately, Rachel is retiring from the board.

Don Stevens holds the Grants and Applications portfolio and as such has made it his business to hunt down all grant opportunities for the Club. We will win one soon Don!

Mike McDonagh who continues in his 13th year as Club Treasurer has found his job a little easier with the new systems and even got the annual financials in on time this year!

Kylie Hurst who so ably fulfills the role of Secretary and assists with Night Owls and saving the 5th side from extinction has worked tirelessly over the past year.

Henry Higgins moved from the position of immediate past president on the Board to an elected Board member position and has ably assisted Steve Hicks with Bowls Operations and has done an outstanding job managing the Adelaide Pioneers.

Last year I articulated three directions the Board would pursue over 2022/23; it is appropriate that I report on these now.

- 1. **Strategy to maintain continuous improvement in our on-green performances** we have had a good year on the greens and the Board is currently reviewing a job description for a Bowls Training and Development Coordinator with a decision imminent.
- 2. **Professional pitch to attract major sponsorship for the Club and the BPL** we have attracted Coopers Brewery as the major sponsor of our BPL franchise, with subsidiary spin offs for the Club.
- 3. **Comprehensive case to expand the car parking available** discussion with the City of Adelaide on a range of matters is imminent, amongst these will be the matter of car parking.

As the Board has established a subcommittee to develop a 3-5 year rolling strategic plan and drafts will be available for member comment, it is not appropriate for me to foreshadow strategic directions here and now.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2022/23, FIN YR ENDED 31 MARCH 2023

The Club reported a net trading profit for the financial year ended 31 March 2023 of \$284,516 (LY \$179,564) after allowing for provisions for depreciation and employee entitlements of \$66,476 (LY \$58,024). The Club's financial position is very sound given positive financial performance over the past two years. Cash in the bank at end of March was \$526,786 compared to the prior year of \$477,581, so a positive movement of \$49,205.

During the year the Club expensed \$213,080 on capital improvements which primarily consisted of:

Kitchen Upgrade, Renovations and Equipment	\$1	76,434
Sound System	\$	20,463
Outdoor Furniture	\$	8,998
Television and IT Associated Items	\$	4,273
Garden Shed	\$	2,912

Total turnover has increased by \$347,880 or 30% which in turn has an impact on costs which have increased by \$226,170. Our bar gross profit margin has been maintained at 70% which is in line with budget. Bar wages have increased by \$32,732 or 29% in line with turnover, but still within our budget KPI of around 20 - 22% of gross bar turnover.

A review of expenditure appears on par with the prior year in relation to overheads, but with the increase in turnover (bar and catering) there is a direct increase in cost of sales.

Tournament expenses are substantial and these relate to Masters, BPL, Super League, 5-a-Side and are up on last year by some \$17000. However, the funding of these expenses via sponsorship and return from BPL prize money is also up by some \$25,000 compared with last year. However, this is probably not a true indication of the impact of tournaments on the Club financially as other related net income from bar sales and catering are not considered.

On the matter of performance, budgeted turnover was exceeded by 28% with gross revenue coming in at over \$1.5M. Net income exceeded budget by 44%, so a terrific result which hopefully can be repeated going forward into next season.

A good deal of credit for this outstanding financial performance must be attributed to our Venue Manager Vee McGovern. She has been the person at the front of it all and has managed the Club's venue hire and social bowling events and the associated in-house activity in a very successful manner. The Board is very grateful for her input, time, and effort. In addition, our contract bookkeeper, Stef Koeppen has ably assisted Vee with the accounting system and they have both provided me with invaluable assistance in my role as Treasurer.

I trust members will appreciate the efforts of the Board, staff and volunteers who have all contributed to ensuring that the Club continues to be financially viable and continuously improve the Club's facilities for the future benefit of all members.

VENUE MANAGERS REPORT 2022/23

The past 12 months have seen some big changes at the Club. We welcomed our new caterer Mick Menzies and team and we are absolutely over the moon with this new partnership. Mick and his professional team have bought ABC food offerings in line with our vision and the quality of the food is outstanding. A big thank you to Mick and his team for their hard work over a very busy Christmas season.

The upgrade to our kitchen has been a long time coming and now completed, has allowed Mick and his team to successfully cater for the large number of corporate events and provide exceptional food offering for our Club events. The new wood fired Pizza oven has been well utilised by corporate bookings and is a great addition to our catering offerings.

We have installed a new sound system which is already proving to be a great investment, bringing quality sound and improved useability for corporate functions and the Club events.

A new partnership with Coopers has improved our drinks range, profitability, and Club aesthetic with the use of their outdoor bar and Coopers umbrellas.

The formation of a strategic planning sub-committee of the Board to plan and make more informed business decisions as well as ensure a balance between bowling and functions.

We have improved our outdoor areas both in aesthetic and capacity with new tables, chairs, and stools.

The 2022/23 season has resulted in a profit increase of 58% on last financial year, revenue has increased by 30% and we are on target with a Cost of Goods Sold at 30% of Turnover.

The recent success can be attributed to the hard-working team of management, Bar and Venue staff, House and Grounds, Green Keeping the ABC Board and volunteers. I thank our hard working, dedicated and professional bar staff, Aaron Farrant, Miles Palmer, Evie Dunstan, Ava Sokolowski, Michael Turner, Lucabelle Nou, Kerri Budd, Olivia Tudorovic, Rianne Thomson, Tamzin Jenke, Simon Kelly, Heather Gunn, Paul Wilson, Louis Farrelly Clarke, Candise Raison and Aleisha Kuczmarski.

A special thank you to Aaron for his ongoing hard work and many years of dedicated work, Miles, Evie, Tamzin and Simon our duty managers who put in a huge effort over the Christmas season to ensure our customers have the best experience possible. Thank you also to Emil Nou, our Club cleaner, for his assistance in function set up throughout the season.

Our Club events such as Night Owls and Sunday Superbowlz are well received by visitors and this is in part attributed to the great music provided by DJ's Hannah Tunstill, Anders Bogdanowicz and Richard Philipson.

GREENS REPORT 2022/23

The past season has been another challenging but successful one for the Club.

The September start to the bowls season began with very cool and often damp conditions. This meant the soil temperatures were cooler than ideal and the grass was very slow coming out of dormancy. This in turn led to a slow recovery from the heavy wear and tear of the previous bowls season and winter usage. I was not happy with the condition of the greens at the start to the season but take some comfort from greenkeeper feedback that many Clubs with grass greens around SA had similar problems

That said, our greens did hold up reasonably well early on and we avoided losing any of our grass coverage. This enabled us to get through the extremely busy November and December period of pennant bowls combined with the large number of social patrons with healthy greens.

The weather was near on perfect for our Xmas renovations, where once again we managed to core and top-dress all 3 of our greens. The reasons behind coring/dusting our greens annually are to remove thatch, aerate and in the long term improve the soil profile. An improved soil profile leads to a more consistent drainage and better retention of nutrients. The thatch layer is where the majority of the diseases reside, and also creates a surface that is soft and therefore plays more slowly for pennant players.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to the members who came out to help complete these renovations over the Xmas break, your assistance is greatly appreciated.

The greens for the remainder of the season looked in good condition and played well. In the past we have encountered difficulties with the ends of our greens the ends. This season we were able maintain good grass coverage throughout the season which is the most important factor. The decision also, whenever possible to play Night Owls and Social Bowls "east-west" on A and C Greens also assisted in maintaining the overall condition of those greens.

The Adelaide Masters was a big success. This year it became a 5-day event starting on the Thursday immediately prior to Good Friday. We had a very busy lead-up to this event with all greens in use a week before for the Women's Finals and the weather forecast for Easter was dismal with rain expected. And so, it happened on Friday morning when the heavens opened and flooded our greens. From there it was an amazing effort from the members and visitors to sweep the water from the greens and get play underway after only a two-hour delay. The greens withstood the drenching and the event was completed smoothly and without any further incident. Fingers crossed for a dry Masters next year.

The Club has many volunteers helping in a range of Club activities. I would like to thank the amazing crew who assist me in doing my job. Led by Bruce Bate, our Monday Blues Crew have been active near on every week. Chris Firth, Henry Higgins, Al Behenna, Gary Julian, Don Stevens, Ron Davidson, John Frangos, Rob Sincock and Simon Frank have all made great contributions to how well our great Club is presented to our members and visitors. Your help does not go un-noticed and is greatly appreciated!

Another mention and thanks go to Bruce, Don, Henry, Al and Chris who help with extra rolling and other jobs during the week. Without this help my job would not only be a lot less enjoyable but also a lot more difficult. You help and friendships means a lot to me. Thankyou.

A big thankyou goes out to Cooper Hocking and Scott 'Buddah' Hocking for giving up their time every Saturday Morning to roll our greens for pennants. Thanks a million boys.



Also, I would like to thank AOBC President Ross Tilley for his assistance in rolling on some Tuesday Mornings.

It is my intention to engage with our core group of Monday volunteers to develop ideas for the future of our outdoor areas around the greens. We will be working on a plan to take to the Board to continuously improve the amenity of our Club.

- 4. 4th umbrella including weather protection between the umbrellas and the northern verandah.

Once again, our outstanding volunteer brigade have excelled. They have tirelessly and unselfishly given of their time and expertise to make our wonderful Club a better place for our members. Every member should try to personally thank our superb volunteers for their contribution to the continued improvement of the Adelaide Bowling Club.
